

INTRODUCTION

Passover is a joyous festival celebrated yearly by Hebrew and Messianic people around the world. Passover always falls on the same date on the Hebrew calendar, having not changed in over 3,500 years. Its message is always timely for the believers in Yeshua HaMashiach (Jesus the Messiah). It is a message of redemption and deliverance from bondage in Egypt to the deliverance from our sins. There is a celebration in (Haggadah) "the telling", in the banquet feast, and in the songs and dance. It is truly a time of joy and thanksgiving.

This booklet is a Haggadah (means "the telling") and has these two purposes in mind:



1. For the born again believer: We need to understand the Biblical Feast of Passover. Our roots as believers in Yeshua are in Biblical Hebrew Roots. At the Passover table, we will come to an understanding that will lead us to a revelation of our Messiah, the redemptive Lamb, Yeshua. This will bring clarity to our Heavenly Father's plan of redemption for us all. We will understand the roots of our faith, the Biblical command to all believers to keep Passover forever, and the debt of love owed to all those who have held to the feasts of YHVH.



2. For the Hebrew people: The message of Passover, as it is presented in the Seder, is not just about a historic event but rather it is prophetic, according to Torah. We will see how YHVH's promise of redemption is fulfilled in the one true Passover Lamb, the Messiah of all Israel, Yeshua HaMashiach. It is His message that is contained in the modern Hebrew's Passover Seder.

THE SEDER PLATE

The Passover Celebration

Karpas

מרור Bitter Herbs

Shown above is the traditional assembly for the Seder plate which includes the following: karpas (parsley, celery, lettuce, onion or potatoes may be used), shank bone of lamb, bitter herbs (horse radish), Charoset (a mixture of finely chopped apples, nuts and cinnamon mixed with a little wine (grape juice).

OTHER ITEMS ON THE SEDER TABLE

Three Matzos: 3 Matzos (unleavened bread) are wrapped in a Matzah Tash. This is a cloth container with 3 separated sections.

Wine (Grape Juice): Wine goblets. Which will represent one of four aspects of the Seder.

Salt Water: Located in the center of the Seder Plate and used for dipping the Karpas (parsley).

NEXT YEAR IN JERUSALEM!

Leader

Now that our Passover service is complete, there is but one thing yet to be said. In the Heart of YHVH's people there abides a longing to celebrate Passover in Jerusalem. Therefore we bless one another with the traditional wish of:

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THE PASSOVER PREPARATION

"Seven days shall you eat unleavened bread; but on the first day you shall remove leaven from your houses..." Exodus 12:15

As Passover draws near, the head of the house gives instructions to the entire household, in the preparation of the Seder. It is a time of cleaning and seeking out any and all leaven in the house. This leaven (called chametz) represents pride and sin and must be removed. The children search with a candle, a feather and wood spoon, to ferret out any piece of leaven that might defile the house and its occupants, as well as the Seder.

Sha'ul (Paul) said in 1 Corinthians 5:6 "Do you not know that a little leaven (chametz) leavens the whole lump?"

Let us prepare for the Passover by opening the rooms of our hearts and allowing the Ruach HaKodesh (Holy Spirit) to illuminate, to seek out and remove that which may be chametz (leaven) in our lives.



WE LIGHT THE CANDLES

"YHVH is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?" Psalms 27:1

As the festival lights are kindled, we ask the Father to bring forth His truth as a great light, that this Passover Celebration may be filled with meaning.

THE WASHING OF FEET

You Are My King

Leader

Foot washing is an intricate part of the evening. It reminds us that as we approached YHVH on His Holy Mountain (Sinai), He commanded us to wash and make ourselves clean before Him. This seems to be a repeated pattern in Scripture when one was about to enter into the presence of our Creator.



Yeshua exemplified His humility when He laid aside His garments, girded Himself with a towel, poured water into a basin in order to begin washing His talmidim's (disciple's) feet and then drying them with the towel.

"...Do you know what I have done to you? You call Me Teacher and Master; and you are right, for so I am. If I then, the Master and Teacher, washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet." John 13:12-14

THE FOUR CUPS OF WINE

"Then YHVH said unto Moses, "Now you shall see what I will do to Pharaoh;..." Exodus 6:1

Leader

The four cups of wine are an ancient tradition of the Passover Seder. Each cup represents one of the four promises made to Israel concerning their freedom from bondage. These promises are stated in Exodus 6:6-7.



All

"...I will bring you out from under the yoke of the Egyptians...
I will free you from being slaves...
I will redeem you with an outstretched arm...
I will take you as my own people, and I will be your Elohim..."

Leader

At Passover we drink from the cups several times. These promises are celebrated among all of YHVH's people. Let us remember the union between the Creator and His people, through Yeshua our Messiah.

These four cups are:

1st Cup: The cup of Sanctification 2nd Cup: The cup of Deliverance 3rd Cup: The cup of Redemption

4th Cup: The cup of Praise, Hope, or Completion

THE KIDDUSH CUP שרק

THE CUP OF SANCTIFICATION "...I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians..." Exodus 6:6



14. "I have given them Your word; and the world has hated them, because they are not of the world, even as I am not of the world.
15. "I do not ask You to take them out of the world, but to keep them from the evil one. 16. "They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. 17. "Sanctify them in the truth; Your word is truth. 18. "As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. 19. "For their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they themselves also may be sanctified in truth. 20. "I do not ask on behalf of these alone, but for those also who believe in Me through their word; 21. that they may all be one; even as You, Father, are in Me and I in You, that they also may be in Us, so that the world may believe that You sent Me. Lifting our cups together, let us bless the name of YHVH and His provision.

THE FOURTH CUP THE CUP OF PRAISE and COMPLETION

Leader

Yeshua did not drink of this cup at His last meal. He said to His disciples:

"But I say to you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom." Matthew 26:29

Leader

However, we drink this final cup of the evening with praise and gratitude in memory of Yeshua's receiving the cup of completion on the cross.

The Festival Meal is Served Blessing After the Meal

ELIYAHU HA-NAVI אליהו הנביא THE PROPHET ELIJAH

Leader



Each year at Passover, the Hebrew people anticipate the coming of Elijah the Prophet. They know that he must come in order to usher in the Messiah that they have been waiting for. Therefore, they always have a place set at the table in hopes that Elijah will come.

ALL

Behold, I am going to send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and terrible day of YHVH." Malachi 4:5

Leader

Yochanan (John) the Baptizer came in the Spirit of Elijah to announce the arrival of Messiah Yeshua and His message. There is strong Biblical evidence that Yochanan was born during the Passover season.

ALL

Yeshua spoke of John saying: "And if you are willing to accept it, John himself is Elijah who was to come." Matthew 11:14

KARPAS

"...and the sons of Israel sighed because of the bondage, and they cried out; and their cry for help because of their bondage rose up to Elohim..." Exodus 2:23

Leader

(Holding up the parsley)

Passover comes in the spring of the year when the earth has come alive and is covered with the freshness of green. This parsley represents the newness of the life that YHVH has given to us.



(Holding up bowl of Salt Water)

Life in Egypt was harsh under its cruel bondage. The salt water represents the tears that flowed from the countless faces of an oppressed people. Let us dip the parsley in the salt water as a remembrance of those tears, and of life that at times is immersed in sorrow.

Though our bondage brought us sorrow with tears, yet YHVH brought us through the Red Sea, and delivered us in victory from our oppressors.

Leader

Let us dip our parsley, eat and remember.

THE FOUR QUESTIONS

"And when your children say to you, 'What does this rite mean to you?' you shall say, 'It is a Passover sacrifice to YHVH who passed over the houses of the sons of Israel in Egypt when He smote the Egyptians, but spared our homes.'" Exodus 12:26-27

A child asks the four questions:

This night is different from all other nights!

- 1. On all other nights we eat bread or Matzah.
 - On this night why do we eat **only** Matzah?
- **2.** On all other nights we eat all kinds of vegetables. On this night why do we eat **only** bitter herbs?
- **3.** On all other nights we do **not** dip our vegetables even **once**. On this night why do we dip them **twice**?
- **4.** On all other nights we eat our meals sitting or reclining. On this night why do we eat **only** reclining?

BLESSINGS FOR BOTH BREAD AND WINE

Leader

TZAFUN צפון THE AFIKOMEN

Leader

It is now time for the children to come and find the Afikomen. When a child has found the Afikomen he or she then holds it for a "ransom" which will be given. The ransom can either be a small amount of money or a piece of candy. Remember the Afikomen was the middle Matzah, which was removed from the Tosh, broken, and hidden away. This is a constant reminder to us of the broken body of Yeshua, who was dead, buried (hidden away) and brought back from the dead for our redemption. Call for missing Matzah.



At this time the papa is to take the Matzah he wrapped in the napkin, break off a piece and pass it around the table for each to take a piece of Matzah for themselves.

THE CUP OF REDEMPTION "...I will redeem you with an outstretched arm...." Exodus 6:6



Leader

This is the third cup. It symbolizes the blood of the Lamb. The Lamb of redemption. It is this cup that Yeshua gave to the first disciples, and said, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood." Luke 22:20

The blood of the Lamb brought redemption to the children of Israel in Egypt. So also the atoning blood of the Lamb of Yah has brought redemption to any and all who will receive Him as Master and Savior.

THE QUESTIONS ARE ANSWERED

"And you shall observe this event as an ordinance for you and your children forever." Exodus 12:24

Leader

Answering the four questions is a privilege and a duty. Therefore showing the mighty and glorious hand of YHVH.

The Matzah The Unleavened Bread

Leader

(Holding the Matzah Tosh)

The unity of three, the Echad. (Echad means one)

All

This represents the patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

Leader

However, this is a picture of the Unity of Elohim (The leader takes out the middle Matzah and instructs the papa to hold up a piece of Matzah. The leader breaks the Matzah and instructs the papa to do so as well.)

All

This is the broken body of Messiah.

Leader

This is the broken body of Messiah.

(The leader wraps one half of the Matzah with a cloth and instructs the papa to wrap one half of his Matzah in the napkin that covered the Matzah for use later in the Seder)

This is the Afikomen, the one that has come and the one that is yet to come.

Baruch Haba B'Shem YHVH. Blessed is He that comes in the name of YHVH.

All the children age 12 and under close your eyes so that we may hide the Afikomen. Parents you may need to help them keep their eyes closed. ©

Leader

I have hidden the Afikomen and it will remain hidden until the 3rd cup. At that time the children will search for it and the one who finds it will be rewarded with a ransom.

All

Yeshua, (He that is to come) rose from the dead on the third day. Blessed is the child that finds the Afikomen.

Leader

The bread that YHVH commanded Israel to eat was unleavened bread (Matzah). There was not enough time for the bread to rise for their journey from Egypt, so they let the sun bake the bread flat. Leaven bread at the time of Passover, came to represent sin, and Elohim wants us to remove all sin from our lives.

"Your boasting is not good. Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump of dough? Clean out the old leaven so that you may be a new lump, just you are in fact unleavened. For Messiah our Passover also has been sacrificed." I Corinthians 5:6-7



See how the Matzah is striped and bruised?

"But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities: The chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and by His stripes we are healed." Isaiah 53:5 **DAYENU**

YHVH's goodness is awesome! For each of His acts of mercy and kindness we declare Dayenu – it would have been sufficient.

Leader All

Had Elohim brought us out of Egypt and not delivered us from the hand of our enemies...

Dayenu

Had He delivered us from our enemies, and not opened the Red Sea...

Dayenu

Had He opened the Red Sea and not watched over us in the wilderness...

Dayenu

If He watched over us in the wilderness for forty years, And not given us manna...

Dayenu

Had He given us Manna, but not given us Torah (teaching)...

Dayenu

Had He given us Torah (teaching) and not brought us to the promised Land...

Dayenu

Had He brought us to the Promised land and not given us Yeshua...

It would <u>NOT</u> have been enough

ALL

PRAISE YHVH FOR THE LAMB!

When Yochanan (John the Immerser) saw Yeshua he said, "Behold, the Lamb of YHVH who takes away the sin of the world." John 1:29

Yeshua came as our Passover Lamb, As Rav Sha'ul (Apostle Paul) said in *I Corinthians 5:7* "...For even Messiah our **Passover** is sacrificed for us."

1 Peter 1:18-19 ~ "knowing that you were not redeemed with perishable things like silver or gold from your futile way of life inherited from your forefathers, but with precious blood, as of a lamb unblemished and spotless, the blood of Messiah."

When we apply His blood to our lives, YHVH's hand of judgment is passed over us. We now have eternal life through the Messiah.



77 Chet (Pronounced Het)

The Chet has a numerical value of 8. The number 8 stands for new beginnings. The number 8 has no beginning or ending, it is eternal.

See how the Matzah is pierced?

"And I will pour upon the house of David, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the Spirit of grace and of supplications: and they shall look upon me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for him as one mourns for his only son..."

Zechariah 12:10

Pass Matzah around the table and each person takes a piece.

MAROR BITTER HERBS

Leader

On all other nights we eat all kinds of vegetables, but on Passover we eat only Maror, bitter herbs.



(Holding up Horseradish)

"...And the Egyptians compelled the sons of Israel to labor rigorously; And they made their lives bitter with hard labor in mortar and bricks, and at all kinds of labor in the field..."

Exodus 1:13, 14

When we dip a piece of Matzah into the Maror, let us remember the tears of those who were once in bondage in Egypt, and remember also there was once a time we were in bondage to sin. With compassion, we do remember.

THE FOUR QUESTIONS

"The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live; and when I see the blood I will pass over you..."

Exodus 12:13

Leader

When Passover was celebrated in Israel's homes there were three essential items on the Passover Table:

- 1. Unleavened bread Matzah
- 2. Bitter Herbs Maror
- 3. Passover Lamb Pesach

Yeshua is our Passover Lamb so we do not prepare Lamb for Passover. However, on the Seder Plate we have a Lamb Shank Bone in remembrance of our Passover Lamb.


All

We have eaten Matzah reminding us of our haste in which we left Egypt. We have eaten bitter herbs reminding us of our bondage and harsh labor.

Leader (Holding up the Shank Bone)



Our forefathers placed the blood of a lamb upon the lintel and door posts of their homes. When the death angel saw the blood, that home was passed over; hence what was done at twilight was realized at midnight.

THE CHAROSET TWICE WE DIP

Leader

The third Question the child asked concerns dipping our vegetables twice.

(Holding up the Charoset)

Great toil and labor were the burdens of the children of Israel. They were forced to make bricks of mud and straw to build magnificent cities for Pharaoh. The Charoset consists of apple, nuts, cinnamon, honey and wine (grape juice). Break off a piece of Matzah and dip it into the Charoset as it is passed around the table.

Leader

Let us eat

Now break off two pieces of Matzah and dip one into the bitter herbs and one into the Charoset and make a sandwich with it. Though life sometimes presents bitterness, it is offset by the sweetness of the hope we have in Yeshua. (Don't eat yet.)

As they were reclining at the table and eating, Yeshua said, "Truly I say to you that one of you will betray Me – one who is eating with Me." They began to be grieved and to say to Him one by one, "Surely not I?" And He said to them, "It is one of the twelve, one who dips with Me in the bowl."

Mark 14:18-20

Leader

Let us eat.







THIS NIGHT WE RECLINE

Leader

We now answer the fourth and final question that is asked by the child. On all other nights we eat our meals sitting, on this night, why do we eat reclining?

While still in Egypt, the children of Israel stood as they ate, with staff in hand and shoes on their feet, ready to leave in a moments notice.

All

It's wonderful to be free of Bondage.

Leader

So let us recline and enjoy this Seder now that we are free.



Yeshua said:

"Come to Me, all you who are weary and heavy-laden, And I will give you rest." Matthew 11:28
